- **Purchase your turkey ONLINE from Palmer's Market before Nov. 14th** and the turkeys will be picked up right from Palmer's for you!

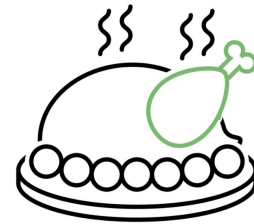

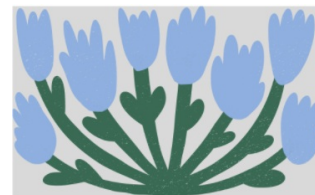
